Chairman's Review

It is my pleasure to present the un-audited condensed interim results of the Company for the nine months period ended December 31, 2011.

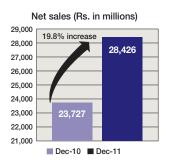
The Economy

The Pakistan economy has shown persistent resilience while facing global economic slowdown, international price dynamics and various domestic challenges. Despite these challenges, the economy is expected to register GDP growth within a range of 3.0% - 3.6%. The key economic variables, such as, foreign exchange reserves and inflation have shown encouraging signs. CPI inflation came down to 9.7% in December 2011 as compared to 15.5% in same period of last year. Foreign currency reserves remained stable at US\$ 16.77 billion due to the all time high overseas remittances. Tax collection showed increase of 27.7%, aggregating to Rs. 507 billion up to Oct'11. On the other hand, surge in fiscal deficit, government borrowing through domestic sources and chronic energy shortages are affecting growth. Pakistan's current account deficit increased to US\$ 2.1 billion during Jul- Nov FY11-12 against US\$ 589 million in the corresponding period, last year. The imbalances on the external front as well as the drying up of foreign investment inflows have pushed the local currency to record low level. Resultantly, rupee depreciated by 4.6% against USD since June 2011.

The agriculture sector's performance was less than expected. The floods in the Southern region of Pakistan caused substantial damage to the standing cotton and rice crops. The rising input costs of electricity and fertilizers together with lower prices for major crops specifically cotton, eroded liquidity for the farmers, leading to lower purchasing power. As a result, sale of consumer durables saw slowdown in the rural areas.

Large Scale Manufacturing (LSM) grew by 2.1% in July - Oct FY11-12 as compared to 1.1% growth of the same period of last year. The major contribution came from automobiles, textiles and leather products. Some momentum was also witnessed in the pharmaceutical and chemical groups. The current problems of severe energy shortage, high input costs and reduced incomes call for better coordinated actions to ensure a sustained growth in LSM.

Operating Results

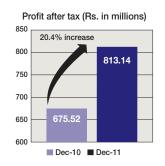


The Company's financial results for the nine months were in line with its strategic plans - delivering stable sales growth, improved operational leverage and a better bottom line. Despite significant challenges during the period under review, the Company registered growth of 19.8% in sales over the corresponding period and recorded an all time high sales figure of Rs. 28.43 billion.

This positive top line growth is attributable to volume increase and better sales mix. However, due to rising prices of raw materials, high inflation and the declining value of

rupee, gross profit percentage declined from 7.4% to 7.0%. The key challenge is to improve this over the course of next year. Distribution and administrative expenses for the nine months period were Rs. 976.55 million, an increase of 18.9% over the corresponding period, however, as percentage of sales, have reduced from 3.5% to 3.4%. The increase in absolute terms mainly represents spending on advertising and promotional activities related to core products,

expansion in dealership network and effects of general inflation. Other income, net of financial charges and other expenses, is registered at Rs. 125.2 million which is an encouraging



71.7% higher than the corresponding period last year. This was achieved through better treasury management and early repayment of borrowings.

The above factors have helped the nine months profit after tax to grow to a level of Rs. 813.14 million as compared to Rs. 675.52 million of last year, an increase of 20.4%. This translates into Earnings Per Share (EPS) of Rs. 11.30 as against EPS of Rs. 9.39 of the corresponding period.

Future Outlook

Given the current economic fundamentals, rising government borrowing, political instability and a looming energy crisis, the outlook for the year 2012 remains challenging. The fragile global economic environment may further suppress domestic growth. There is an urgency to implement sound economic reforms, apply long term economic management principles and introduce alternate power sources for creating conducive environment for a prosperous Pakistan. Agriculture, with a 25% share of the economy, could remain the nucleus of economic growth. Reasonable support prices, improved acreage in major crops and timely financial support by GoP to farmers could bring favorable results for the overall economy. The domino effect of agricultural growth always boosts the two wheeler industry due to its role as the main source of transportation in the rural areas.

Your Company has exhibited good performance against the challenges of the economy, competition, rising raw material prices and vulnerability of exchange rate. Due to expanded capacity, the Company is uniquely positioned in creating value for its stakeholders on the back of a strong financial position and a well defined growth plan to meet the challenges ahead. The Company is focused on further investing in its product line and marketing its products as the first choice of customers:

Notes to the Condensed Interim Financial Information (Unaudited)

For the Nine Months Period Ended December 31, 2011

1. Legal Status and Operations

Atlas Honda Limited (the Company) was incorporated as a public limited company on October 16, 1962 under the Companies Act, 1913, now Companies Ordinance, 1984. Currently, the shares of the Company are listed on Karachi and Lahore stock exchanges of Pakistan. The registered office is located at 1-Mcleod Road, Lahore. The Company is principally engaged in progressive manufacturing and marketing of motorcycles and spare parts. The manufacturing and assembly facilities of the Company are located at Karachi and Sheikhupura, with branches, warranty and training centres and other offices located at Karachi, Multan, Lahore, Rahim Yar Khan and Rawalpindi.

2. Basis of Preparation

- 2.1 This condensed interim financial information of the Company for the nine months period ended December 31, 2011 is unaudited and is being submitted to the shareholders in accordance with the requirements of section 245 of the Companies Ordinance, 1984 (the Ordinance) and the listing regulations of Karachi and Lahore stock exchanges and has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the International Accounting Standard 34, 'Interim Financial Reporting' (IAS 34) and provisions of and directives issued by the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP) under the Ordinance. Wherever the requirements of IAS 34 differ from the requirements of the Ordinance or directives issued by the SECP, the Ordinance and the said directives have been followed.
- 2.2 This condensed interim financial information does not include all the information and disclosures required in the annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the annual audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended March 31, 2011.
- 2.3 This condensed interim financial information is presented in Pak Rupee, which is the functional currency of the Company. All the financial information presented in Pak Rupee has been rounded off to the nearest thousand, except for earnings per share which are presented in whole figures.

3. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

- 3.1 The accounting policies and the methods of computation followed in the preparation of this condensed interim financial information are the same as those applied in the preparation of the annual audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended March 31, 2011, except for the adoption of new accounting policies as referred to in note 3.2 and 3.3.
- **3.2** Following amendment to existing approved accounting standard became effective for the periods beginning on or after January 1, 2011 and is relevant to the Company:

IAS 34 (Amendment), 'Interim financial reporting'. This amendment provides guidance to illustrate how to apply disclosure principles in IAS 34 and add disclosure requirements around the circumstances likely to affect fair values of financial instruments and their classification, transfers of financial instruments between different levels of the fair value hierarchy, change in classification of financial assets and changes in contingent liabilities and assets. The amendment has resulted in an additional disclosure as presented in note 16 to this condensed interim financial information.

4. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

- 4.1 The preparation of this condensed interim financial information requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgment in the process of applying the Company's accounting policies. Estimates and judgments are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting estimates will, by definition, seldom equal the related actual results, however, the differences are not expected to be significant.
- 4.2 During the preparation of this condensed interim financial information, the significant judgments made by the management in applying the Company's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation and uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the annual audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended March 31, 2011.

- 10.1 The Company has facilities for short-term running finance from various commercial banks under mark-up arrangements amounting to Rs. 2,865,000 thousand (March 31, 2011: Rs. 2,865,000 thousand). The facilities carry mark-up at the rate of Re. 0.3745 to Re. 0.4052 (March 31, 2011: Re. 0.3518 to Re. 0.4030) per thousand per day on daily product basis and are secured against pari passu joint-hypothecation charge over Company's stock-intrade and trade debts upto a maximum of Rs. 4,058,000 thousand (March 31, 2011: Rs. 4,058,000 thousand). These facilities are expiring on various dates by March 31, 2012. The mark-up on running finance facilities is payable on quarterly basis. There is no availed balance outstanding against these facilities as at December 31, 2011.
- **10.2** The Company also has a facility for foreign currency finance and export re-finance amounting to Rs. 400,000 thousand (March 31, 2011: Rs. 400,000 thousand), secured against lien on export bills / contracts.

16. Financial Risk Management

- 16.1 This condensed interim financial information does not include all the financial risk management information and disclosures required in the annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the annual audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended March 31, 2011. The Company's activities expose it to a variety of financial risks, which are (i) market risk (including foreign currency risk, interest rate risk and other price risk), (ii) credit risk and (iii) liquidity risk. There has been no significant change in Company's sensitivity to these risks since March 31, 2011, except for the (a) reduction of exposure from liquidity risk due to early repayment of borrowings and (b) general exposure due to fluctuations in foreign currency and interest rates. There have been no changes in the treasury department and risk management objectives and policies of the Company during the period.
- 16.2 Short-term investments of the Company, as given in note 8 are recognized at fair value and are placed at level 1 in the fair value measurement hierarchy, due to the reason that they are tradable at a quoted price in the active market. There were no significant changes in the business or economic circumstances during the period that would have affected the fair value of the financial assets of the Company. No reclassifications in the categories of financial assets have been made since March 31, 2011.
